


NEWS2

SCAS introduced NEWS2 on 06/02/18

The key differences are:

- Different oxygen scale for patients with chronic hypoxia:
 - should reduce over-triage of COPD patients
 - improve patient safety
- Introduction of <u>new</u> confusion

Training

- NEWS2 has been incorporated into mandatory (face-to-face) training for 2018. All frontline staff are receiving training on NEWS2 / Recognition of the deteriorating patient.

NEWS2 has not been inserted into the latest ePR update – as un-embedding it will affect all the CPI changes. For now NEWS will be displayed at the bottom of each set of vital signs.

It is hoped that NEWS2 will be fully live on ePR in September 2018





Challenges



Hospital uncertainty about NEWS2

Some hospitals are not using NEWS or NEWS2. Our crews are transient and may take patients to a variety of hospitals in the course of a shift

One hospital has been using 3 different screening tools.....

A quote from an ED consultant: 'what the f*** is NEWS2'!

Uncertainty about Scale 2 for Chronic Hypoxia

FAQs include:

'Do I measure a NEWS2 before I apply oxygen?



Challenges

Limitations of NEWS

- Pre-Hospital Evidence lacking (but an amazing opportunity)
- Pregnant Patients
- Children <12

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ePR - POPS scoring



SCAS have implemented POPS scoring for <16s

The guidance for our crews......

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If NEWS2 is less than 5....

- Patients scoring 0-1 are unlikely to have sepsis and are probably suitable for discharge with safety-netting advice
- NEWS2 score 2-4 will generally be discussed with a clinician, such as a GP or out of hours clinician.
- If a patient has one extremity marker, i.e. a respiratory rate of 26 (which scores 3) then clinicians should <u>always</u> consider if sepsis <u>could be</u> present.

If sepsis NEWS2 is 5 or 6.....

Patients scoring 5-6 will be conveyed to hospital with <u>consideration</u> of oxygen /IV fluids and a <u>consideration</u> of passing a pre-alert if clinicians are concerned.

A NEWS 5 or more in the presence of suspected infection should prompt the clinician to **THINK SEPSIS!**

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If sepsis is suspected and if NEWS2 is 7 or more.....

- Administration of IV fluids if BP<90mmHg
- · Administration of oxygen
- · Minimal time 'on scene'
- Pre-alert to nearest hospital
- Blue light transfer

This will be an ACQI measure

Antibiotics

Crews are already giving antibiotics to suspected meningococcal septicaemia

However they will not be (currently) administering antibiotics to suspected sepsis cases. This relates to:

- Blood cultures
- Variation in antimicrobial strategies pan SCAS
- Short travel times to hospital

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NEWS2 App – Released 01/03/18

The app can be switched between NEWS / NEWS2 in the settings menu

and takes 15 seconds to complete vs 45+ seconds on paper.
