## National Data Opt-Out and how it affects the LeDeR Programme

The national data opt-out applies to deaths notified to the LeDeR programme from 6<sup>th</sup> March 2020 onwards. Deaths notified before that date are not affected. The national data opt-out allows anyone to opt-out of having their confidential information used for purposes beyond the direct provision of their care and treatment, such as for research or service evaluation.
