## Update on new LeDeR web based platform

SCW (South, Central and West Commissioning Support Unit) continues the development on the new web-based platform for the LeDeR programme, through a series of phases, which will deliver a product ready for use. We are working with people who already use the current system to test the new system, to ensure it will be easy to use when launched. SCW are working closely and effectively with the University of Bristol and NHSE to ensure a smooth transition, including an agreed transition plan and data transfer processes. The new web-based platform will be available by June 2021.
